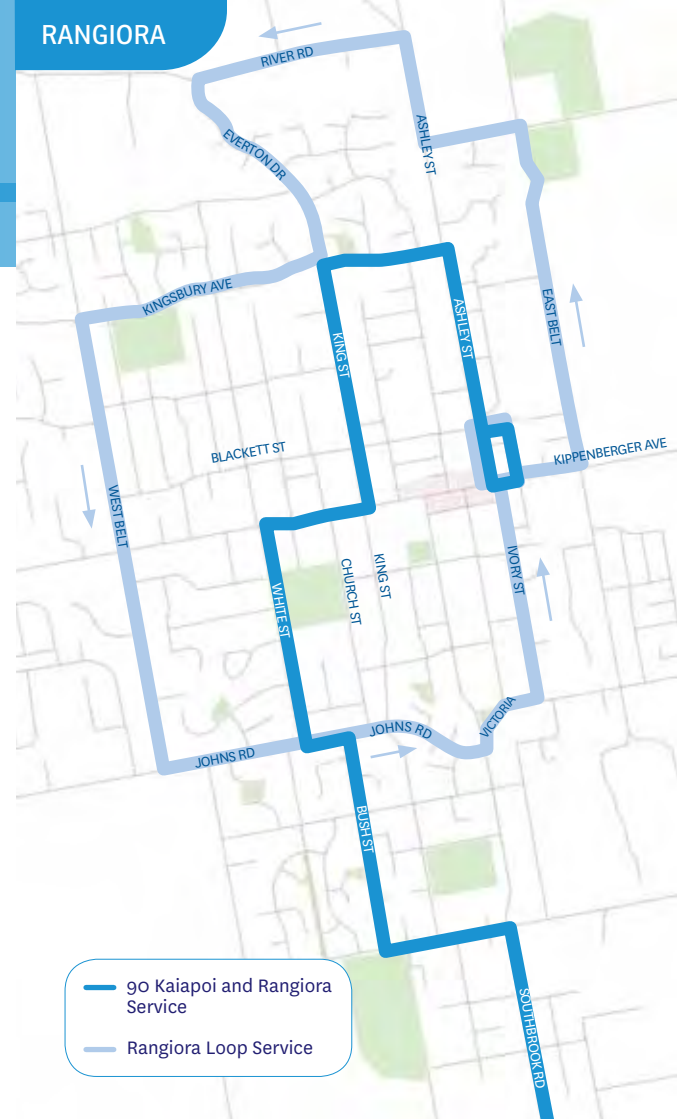
HERE IS WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED...

BUS SERVICES IN RANGIORA

Services in Rangiora will change due to the proposed discontinuation of the 92 Rangiora (via Woodend and Waikuku) and 912 and 913 shuttle services. The 90 route will be altered slightly, and will no longer travel along Green St and Charles St. Also, it will turn right from King St into Kingsbury Ave, rather than travelling via Enverton Drive and River Rd.

A new route, the Rangiora Loop Service, will be created. This service will travel around the township in one direction only, following an anti-clockwise circle. It will connect passengers to the 90 service, and will also bring residents from the edges of Rangiora to the town centre. The route will travel past Rangiora High School, Rangiora Hospital, the showgrounds and a number of parks.

The Rangiora Loop Service will begin at the Ashley St terminus, and then turn left into High St. It will travel around the town on East Belt, Coldstream Rd, Ashley St, River Rd, Enverton Dr, Kingsbury Ave, West Belt, Johns Rd, Percival St, Victoria St, Northbrook Rd and Ivory St, ending at Ashley St.





BUS SERVICES IN KAIAPOI

The 90 Kaiapoi and Rangiora service will continue to serve Kaiapoi, but following requests for a quicker route to Christchurch, it is proposed that it will travel to Belfast along Ohoka Rd and the Northern Motorway. The new Woodend, Pegasus and Waikuku Beach service will travel via Williams St through Kaiapoi, and then along the Main North Rd to Belfast.

The Kaiapoi to the Palms via Brooklands service will travel through parts of eastern and western Kaiapoi which do not currently have a bus service, providing greater access to public transport for residents.

The 90 Kaiapoi and Rangiora service would continue to run at its current daytime frequency of every 30 minutes Monday - Saturday and hourly on Sundays and in the evenings.

- Kaiapoi to The Palms via Brooklands Service
- Service ends on Charles Street near the Information centre



BROOKLANDS

KAIAPOI TO THE PALMS VIA BROOKLANDS

It is proposed that this service will replace the existing 480 Kainga service. It will start at The Palms shopping centre and travel on Marshland Rd to Lower Styx Rd. The service will no longer travel via Heyders Road, instead continuing along Lower Styx Rd through Spencerville to Brooklands. The route in Brooklands will stay the same. From Brooklands the service will travel directly along Kainga Road turning right onto Main North Road, meaning the service will no longer travel into Stewarts Gully. It will continue along the Main North Rd to Williams St in Kaiapoi.

In Kaiapoi it will travel in both directions via Vickery St, Isaac Wilson Rd, Robert Coup Rd, Ohoka Rd, Otaki St, Fuller St, Williams St, Cass St, Feldwick Dr, Moore St, Jollie St and Charles Street. It will terminate on Charles St near the Information Centre.

This service is proposed to run hourly Monday to Saturday and every two hours on a Sunday.

It is proposed that this service will become a Northern Star service.



WOODEND, PEGASUS AND WAIKUKU BEACH SERVICES

The current 92 service and 912 and 913 shuttles will be replaced with a direct service from the Christchurch city to Woodend via Kaiapoi. From Woodend the service will split, with half of the trips continuing to Pegasus town and the other half to Waikuku Beach.

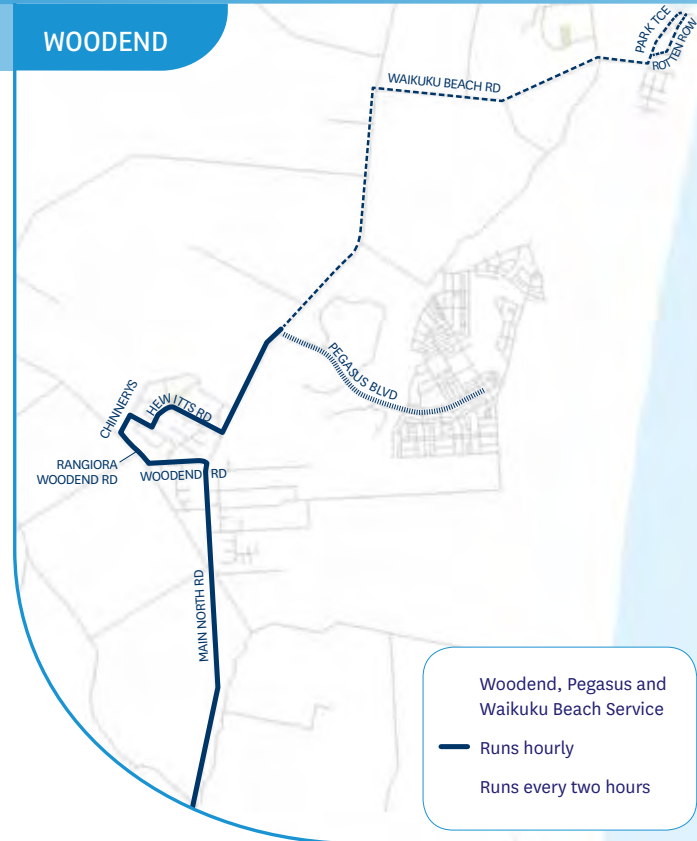
Until it reaches Woodend, the new service will follow the same route as the current service. A new route through Woodend township will provide better access to public transport for residents. The service will travel via Woodend Rd, Rangiora Woodend Rd, Chinnerys Rd, Welsford St, and Hewitts Rd. Services to Woodend are proposed to run hourly from Monday to Sunday.

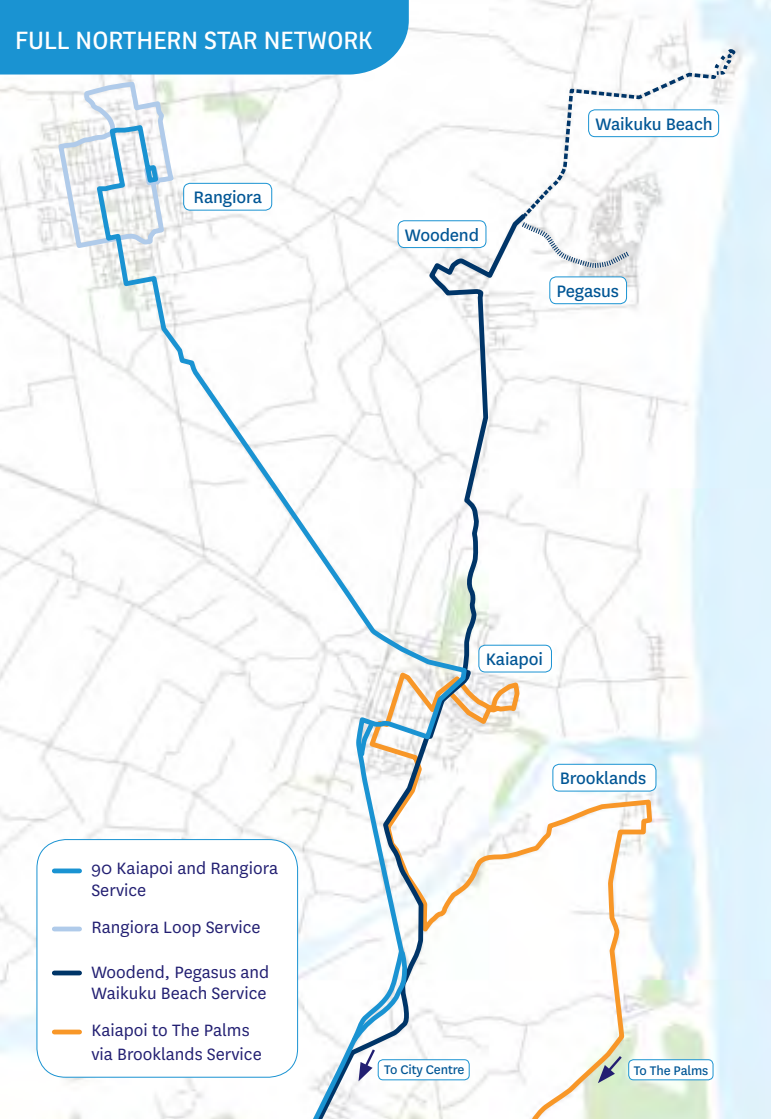
The service to Pegasus Town will travel straight down Pegasus Boulevard to terminate near the General Store. The Waikuku Beach service will continue to use the existing route. Services to Waikuku Beach and Pegasus will run every 2 hours from Monday to Sunday.

Eventually, it is intended that the Pegasus and Waikuku Beach services will be combined into one service with an hourly frequency. However, this cannot occur until Kaiapoi Pa Road has been sealed and road connections within Pegasus Town are completed.

People wishing to travel between Rangiora and Woodend will have the option of transferring between services in Kaiapoi.
