Metro can help you get to Christchurch Hospital easily by taking the bus

Take the hassle out of trying to find a car park and take the bus. Approximately 600 accessible Metro buses go directly past the hospital every day, picking up and dropping off passengers at bus stops located directly outside the hospital.

Additionally, approximately 1,000 buses per day go to the central city Bus Interchange, where you can get on a bus to the hospital, only a few minutes away from the Interchange.

Take a look at the map (on reverse) to see the connecting bus routes. Another option is to leave your car near a bus stop convenient to you, and take the bus to the hospital.

What is an accessible bus?

All buses have priority seating areas near the front of the bus for passengers with wheelchairs, mobility aids or service animals and for parents with prams.

All Christchurch buses have super-low floors and the ability to kneel to meet the curb. Please ask the driver if you need the bus to kneel.

There are also wheelchair ramps to allow for easy access for most wheelchair users. The driver will manually fold these out.

Information about the Bus Interchange

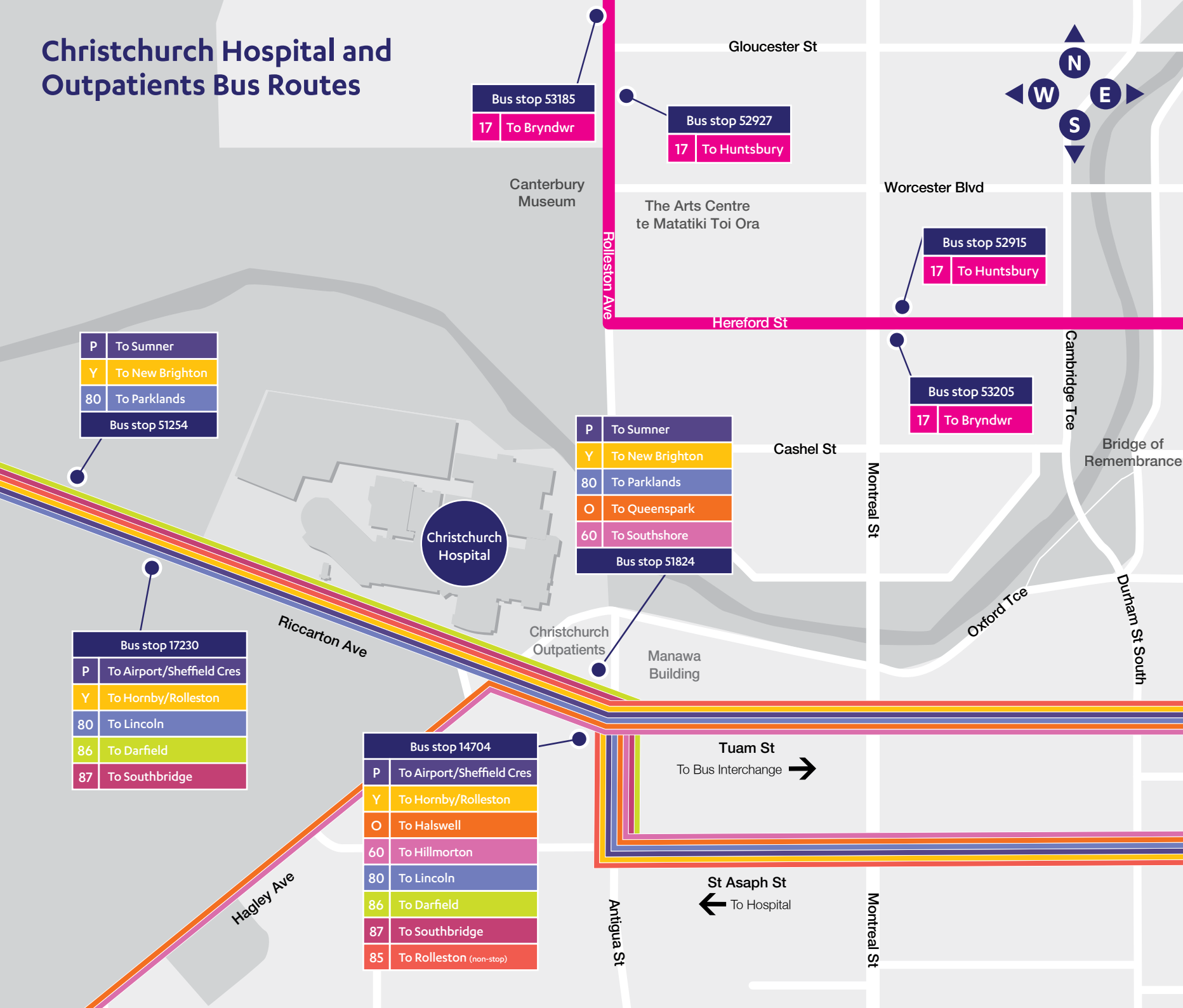
Inside the Interchange, platform bollards show you where each bus will pick you up. For sight impaired passengers, the bollards have buttons to let you know the platform you are at. There are also tactile pavers that direct you to the bus bays and doors to board buses.

The Interchange has wheelchair access, bike storage and toilet facilities.

From here, you can also get a connecting bus to the hospital (turn over to view bus routes going to the hospital).

Our knowledgeable team behind the Metroinfo counter can advise you which bus to board to go to the hospital. They are open 7.30am-6pm weekdays and 9am-5pm weekends.
